Barriers and Bridges

(The Seven Deadly Sins and Seven Living Virtues)

“Ash Wednesday” is February 22—inaugurating the 40 days of spiritual reflection and preparation which is Lent. With Christians around the world, the Strawbridge Family will be encouraged to prayerfully consider what we might give up and what we might take on—all in the hopes of enhancing our walk with God in Christ, and of arriving at Easter morning with a new sense of life and living.

We'll be helped in our reflections through a series of sermons focusing on the “seven deadly sins” and “seven living virtues.” The series title is “Seven Barriers, Seven Bridges,” speaking to how sins block us from God and neighbor even as the counterbalancing virtues have a way of bridging us to God and neighbor.

Individuals and groups so desiring (like Sunday school classes and other small groups) can “shadow” this series using Maxie Dunnam’s study, *The Workbook on the Seven Deadly Sins* (published by the Upper Room and available at Amazon for \$11.05). Weekly titles and texts in the series (including a definition of relevant chapters and units from the workbook) are below:

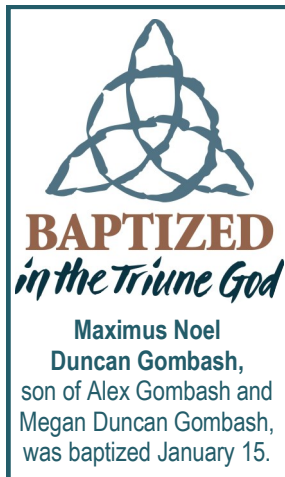

The Advent and Christmas Seasons were truly special for Strawbridge:

- Donated 140 gifts to The Mission Northeast Christmas Store
- Sent almost 200 Wal-Mart gift cards, along with personalized messages, to residents of The United Methodist Children’s Home in Waco
- Collected \$500 from sale of cards, hand-drawn by a disabled Nepali missionary
- Contributions to the 2011 Advent Offering totaled more than \$24,500. After satisfying 2012 covenant commitments with three of our local mission partners (Samaritan Center, The Mission Northeast, Family Promise of Lake Houston) and offering a \$2,000 “transitional” gift to retiring missionaries, Bill and Jerri Savuto (Kenya), we were still able to add almost \$10,000 to our Habitat building fund!

Strawbridge, and partner Woodridge Baptist Church, have started construction on our third Habitat for Humanity house. As of year-end, we are in a position to satisfy all financial commitments and have a combined roster of more than 100 volunteers. The anticipated completion date is June, 2012.

During 2011, approximately 360 members of the Strawbridge family volunteered their time in support of at least one outreach ministry. In a non-Habitat year, this represents a notable improvement. Leading the way were the All-Youth Mission Trip and Family Promise which attracted 160 and 130 volunteers, respectively. The Mission Team will continue to place emphasis on identifying and advertising opportunities to serve.

Please note that donations reported here represent “second-mile” giving, which is completely independent of the church operating budget. However, the operating budget also has a missional component—specifically, UMC conference and district apportionments which Strawbridge pays each year, 42 percent of which support mission-related projects. In 2011, UMC paid \$51,375 in missions-related apportionments.
